Message from the Director

I had no idea when I envisioned the creation of the Center for Women, Gender and Global Leadership (CWGGL), how that journey would begin. The generous gift from Howard University Trustee Jim Murren, and Heather Hay Murren set my path to this journey of creating a center of excellence for Black women, feminist activism and transformational global leadership. It has been seven months since the center officially launched on October 20, 2021, and I am humbled to see how far we have come.



With the announcement of the gift from Howard University Trustee Jim Murren and Heather Hay Murren in November 2020, I immediately begun mapping the structure and design of the new center, and programming was well on the way before we officially launched on October 20, 2021.

The biggest pre-launch event was in March 2021 when President Frederick signed on as a gender champion under the UN Women HeForShe Campaign. The second event that brought a sense of pride and achievement was the center's first program to celebrate International Women's Day, and this was done in the midst of the raging global pandemic, where we celebrated women first responders at Howard University Hospital.

Each day, I am learning to be the best leader I can be. I will be drawing from my personal experiences and the wise counsel of those who have freely given up their time and talent to mentor me. My leadership nugget for this quarter is:

"Surround yourself with people who value you, who respect your vision, who hold you up and not tear you down. A leader's worth begins with how much they value their strengths, skills and capabilities."




HeForShe


International Women's Day Fireside Chat





Women's History Month Exhibition






Environmental Justice Panel Co-sponsored with HUSA




